

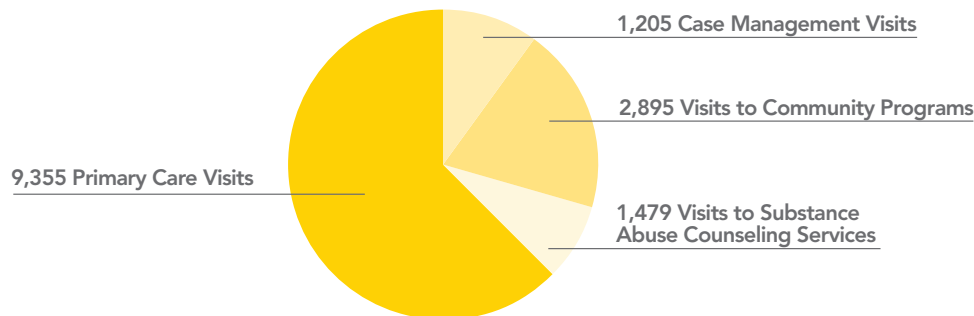
Annual Report 2007 – 08

Serving the Tenderloin and South of Market neighborhoods since 1972, Curry Senior Center provides a full range of health and social services for over 2,000 at-risk, low-income seniors annually.

Overall Performance

2007-08 Program Statistics

Curry services were in high demand over the 2007-08 Fiscal Year with a total of 14,934 service visits.



■ 1,205 Case Management Visits

The Curry Senior Center Case Management team links elders to appropriate support, enabling them to remain living independently in their home. This includes assistance with receiving meals, homemaking, benefit paperwork, housing applications and much more.

■ 2,895 Visits to Community Programs

Our Community Programs include a wide range of socialization, education, nutrition and translation services to the Tenderloin's multi-ethnic community. Programs are provided in partnership with New Leaf and ARC. Staff also assist with translation in the Primary Care Clinic to ensure accurate communication between medical provider and clients.

■ 1,479 Visits to Substance Abuse Counseling Services

Substance Abuse Services include individual and group counseling sessions as well as group work.

■ 9,355 Primary Care Visits

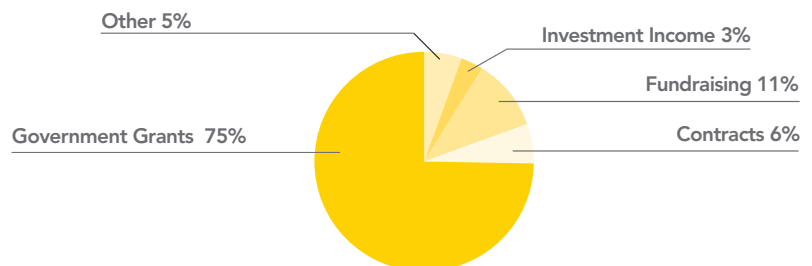
Primary care visits with doctors, nurse practitioners and nurses, as well as with Podiatry, and Pharmacy specialists, and the UCSF Eye Van. Curry's lead medical staff spend 25% of their time on home visits to home bound seniors.

■ 90,110 Meals Served - 2 meals a day, 365 Days a year

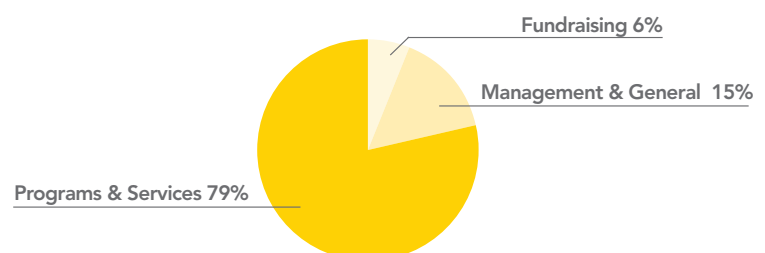
