Planned Giving

Continuing the Legacy

As Curry Senior Center plans for its future, it is important to remember the hard work and guidance of founders Francis J. Curry, MD and Joseph Mignola, Jr.

Beginning in 1972, they recognized that seniors in San Francisco were an underserved population and needed health care and social services to lead a healthy life. Their realization led to the creation of Curry Senior Center and, today, regardless of income and insurance, seniors can receive outstanding health and social services while also maintaining their dignity and independence.

Importance of Having an Estate Plan

Having an estate plan allows you to control what happens to your property and assets, after you are gone. It should clearly express your intent about persons and disposition of your assets. An estate plan states what assets you own, who should receive those assets, your wishes regarding charitable gifts, and who you choose to be your executor and/or the guardian of your children.

If you don't have an estate plan or will, the state probate court, through a court-appointed representative, will tell your heirs what they may or may not do with your property, who gets a share of it, if any, and when they will get it. In addition, the court will not assist in reducing the tax burden of your estate.

Preparing an Estate Plan

It is advisable to seek the counsel of an attorney when making your estate plan and will. Statutory wills can be also purchased at office supply stores or online, but provide for basic disposition of your assets and property and have only limited choices. PLANNED GIVING OPTIONS

There are many ways to include Curry Senior Center in your planned giving, including cash, securities, real estate, personal property, IRAs and insurance policies. A few of the most common instruments are as follows:

SPECIFIC BEQUEST

Name Curry Senior Center as a beneficiary in your will. The benefit of this option is that it allows full control of your assets during your lifetime and a donation that is fully exempt from estate tax.

RESIDUAL BEQUEST

Designate to Curry Senior Center the remainder of your estate after specific bequests have been made.

CONTINGENT BEQUEST

Provide for Curry Senior Center only if beneficiaries listed in the will are no longer alive.

TESTAMENTARY TRUST

Place a portion of your estate in trust to support a beneficiary. The assets are given to Curry Senior Center after the beneficiary's death.
